- 21. General architectural description: A variant of the single story wood frame Miner's Cottage. A hip roof with a short ridge on a rectangular plan. A small front gable projects from the left side of the hipped roof section, adjacent to it is a shallow pitch shed roof porch. The porch has a single turned post, and a similar pilaster at the wall. The door sits 90° to the street on the gable form. The gable has one large double hung to the left and a smaller fixed window to the right. The volume extends to the back of the site, and creates a similar geometry on the rear. The east side has a large double hung similar to the main façade, and two other shorter double hungs toward the back with a square casement at the back of the house. The addition has a series of casement windows and an entry door facing the cross street, with aluminum siding. A very short chimney sits on the peak of the hip facing north.
