The front of the ell has a single double hung in a shallow bay with brackets at the sill, and a large triangular pediment which engages the edge of the mansard roof eave. A dormer sits directly above with double hung window and a triangular pediment roof. The other side of the ell, to the north, has a similar dormer with a shed roof porch below. The porch has turned posts, a simple balustrade, cut-out brackets, and a spindle frieze. The entry door has a transom, and a large double hung adjacent to it.
