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21. General architectural description: A single story wood frame mining era cottage. A side gable structure with a shed roof porch projecting off the front and a shed roof addition on the rear. The shed roof porch is overframed on the side gable, and is supported by turned posts. An entry door, a single double hung and a rectangular 'picture' window sit on the primary wall below the roof. The rear shed addition is also overframed on the side gable, with another door and minimal window openings. A single double hung sits off center on the west, otherwise openings are contemporary. The east side has similar contemporary openings to the front, with another door.

23. Landscaping or special setting features: Historic lilac mass in center of front yard
24. Associated buildings, features, or objects: A small gable outbuilding with vertical siding and asphalt roof.
