	rubble stone foundation. The main volume is covered by a hipped roof form with a short ridge, and flat
	roof section. A gable extends off the east side, a turret encloses the corner of the main volume on the
	southwest side. The turret is octagonal in plan and has a steep flared roof form with a finial at the peak.
	A shed porch roof extends from the center of the turret wall across the face of the hipped roof form and
	ends just past the entry door. It has turned posts, a tall geometric balustrade, and spindle frieze, no
	brackets. Vertically proportioned double hungs fill each exposed 45° face of the octagon, a single entry
	door, with transom, and another double hung are centered on the hipped roof volume below the porch
	roof. The extension of the wall has a single wider double hung centered on its surface. Behind the turre
	is a shallow bay and a single story addition at the rear of the house. The gable extending to the east has
	a wide bay window with glass on the sides and a multi-paned fixed window on the front, the gable is
	repeated on the far side of the main volume creating a 'U'-shaped plan on the east side. A new brick
	chimney extends up on the north side of the 'U', a corbelled chimney sits on the south side of the 'U', and
	a corbelled brick chimney sits on the flat section of the main volume roof.
